


# Webinar on An Awareness Campaign Against Covid-19


### 14th to 15th August




Day 3






# An Expert Talk on Women's Property Rights under Gender Equity Promotion Programme in SACCM

To acquaint the students about women's property rights, Dr. Aman Amrit Cheema, Professor, University Institute of Law, Panjab University Regional Centre, Ludhiana was invited to deliver a talk on topic 'Women Property Rights vis-a-vis Hindu Law' under the scope of 'Gender Equity Promotion programme' on Jan 24, 2020 in Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management.

Dr. Aman stated that the source of Hindu Law is Vedas and dharamshastras. She familiarized the audience with Hindu succession Act, 1956 and Hindu succession (Amendment) Act, 2005. She ended her talk with conclusion that prior to 2005, the women were not having equal status as they had limited rights over father's property but after 2005 amendments, the unequal status continues but now the men are at disadvantageous position.

After the interactive session with students, Dr. Cheema was honoured by the Principal of the college.



On this occasion, close to 100 children planted 200 saplings and took pledge to plant at least one sapling every year. They dso took pledge to look after the






