How the speaker stands, does he look at the audience, is he making any distracting gestures, Fearlessness, Does he appear to be speaking with ease or is he tense.

LANGUAGE (25 Marks)

The Diction, Fluency, Clarity of Speech, Is language easily understandable, Use of slang is not allowed.

DELIVERY (25 Marks)

Voice Modulation, Expressions, Speed and pauses, Ability to hold the attention of the audience.




World Environment Day Celebration, 2021 Report
